FLORIDA LAWS & RULES (4 PDH)

This topic is required before license renewal deadline of February 28, 2013. This course fulfills that requirement through fast moving presentations by legal and engineering experts who are knowledgeable on the Engineering Registration Law and the Rules of the Board of Professional Engineers and its practical applications. ALTERNATIVE DELIVERY METHODS (4 PDH – AREA OF PRACTICE)

The project delivery process is evolving at a rapid pace. The completion, construction, and revenue generating potential of projects are becoming focal points in project delivery. This session examines alternatives to the traditional design-bid-build process including Fast-Track, Design-Build, and Integrated Project Delivery methods. We will discuss the role Building Information Modeling (BIM) plays in facilitating these alternative delivery methods and look for solutions to the obstacles that stand in the way of implementing innovations in how we execute design and construction projects.
